Information about Mass stipends:

In the Catholic Church, a Mass stipend is a donation given by the laity to a priest for celebrating a Mass for a particular intention. Despite the name, it is considered as a gift or offering (Latin: stips) freely given rather than a payment (Latin: stipendium) as such. We try and say the mass on the date requested but sometimes this is not possible.

As it is considered simony for priests to request payment for a Mass, the donors decide upon the amount of the stipend, and are received as gifts. Typically, the diocese suggests a minimum donation for Mass stipends. The normal donation for a Mass in the Diocese of Hallam is £10 but the Mass will never be denied for anything less or no stipend at all.

Code of Canon Law, canon 945 states that:

In accordance with the approved custom of the Church, any priest who celebrates a Mass may accept an offering to apply the Mass for a specific intention.

During November a list of your masses for the deceased of your family is presented to the priest and a number of masses are said for everyone on the deceased Dead List.

A Mass card signed by the priest for some family member who has died is normally given to the deceased person's relatives. The priest says the Mass for that person in due course. Mass Intention cards, signed by the priest are also given to people who may be ill or have other intentions to pray for. These Mass cards are available at the church.
