**Contactless Giving:** Thank you for continued generosity in your weekly collection. The contactless giving machine is in place at the back of the church for all your giving matters in the parish, including: Sunday Collection, Mass Stipends if you want a Mass said for a particular intention, Tea and Coffee after Mass, and any other second collections that may be on that week.

Second Collection next Sunday for Missio (World Mission Sunday): Next Sunday (22<sup>nd</sup> October was printed in error last week) there will be a second collection for the Catholic Church's Mission overseas. Missio ignites God's love by helping local missionaries to work alongside global communities that are poor or in need, regardless of their background or belief. Sometimes this need might be very specific: a motorbike for a Priest to celebrate Mass in remote villages; a simple community hall so people can gather together; vaccinations to protect vulnerable children. Whatever our missionaries need to help them share the joy of the Gospel, Missio strives to provide it.

#### This week's top tip for getting the most out of Holy Mass:

Before Mass take time to read the readings ahead of time. Think or meditate on how these readings may apply to you, or your life at this current time. If you read the readings before you go to church, when you hear them proclaimed, the Word of God will be fresh in your memory, and God will be able to use the Scriptures to speak to you more easily. Spending quality time in prayer with the readings before Mass, whether ten minutes or a half hour depending on your schedule, will significantly improve your receptivity to God's Word as it is proclaimed.
