Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion: Recommissioning for extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion will take place during both Sunday masses next week, 3 December (First Sunday of Advent).

This week's top tip for getting the most out of Holy Mass:

If you are afraid to go deeper at Mass, ask why. Often sins in our lives are at the root of our fear to be intimate with God. If we sincerely ask to be allowed to see and confront the weaknesses that hold us back, we can recognize them and bring them to confession. At the beginning of the Mass, the liturgy first begins with the penitential rite which highlights the importance of needing to acknowledge our failures before partaking in the Holy Sacrifice. Our sins weigh us down like a balloon rising up to the sky, in order for the 'lifting up of our hearts' to God, we need to cut away from the things we know hold us back. At every confession, the loving mercy of Our Lord is available, unreserved, and in unlimited fashion. Let us not be held back by our sins but instead be ready to experience the graces of Holy Communion more readily and in a much greater depth.

Saint of the Week: St. Andrew (30th November)

He was born in Bethsaida, in Galilee, and worked as a fisherman. He may have been a disciple of St John the Baptist. He became one of the first to follow Jesus and introduced his brother, Simon Peter, to him. As one of the twelve Apostles he was widely venerated in ancient times, and became patron saint of Scotland because according to legend some of his bones were brought there and buried at the place where the town of St Andrew's now stands.

He witnessed first-hand, the ministry of Jesus. He preached in Greece, and along the Black Sea. He was martyred in Greece, on a cross shaped in the form of an X. He deemed himself unworthy to be crucified in the same manner as our Lord. There are many writings about St. Andrew from the second century, which confirms his life and works. Without the great work and lives of the Disciples, the faith would not be around for us today. We would do well in passing the Gospels of Christ on to those around us, in both words and actions.
