Live Simply Churches Together:

St Vincent's Parish was represented by a few of our community at the Churches Together event at Bolehills this last Sunday.

We made some new connections with like-minded parishoners from other churches in Crookes and enjoyed spending time together doing activities such as making seedballs and origami animals. We chatted and reflected on what was happening to our planet before writing a prayer to hang on the prayer tree. There was a sharing table outside which was well received. Altogether, a lovely afternoon. Thank you to all who took part!

Contactless Giving: Thank you for continued generosity in your weekly collection. The contactless giving machine is in place at the back of the church for all your giving matters in the parish, including: Sunday Collection, Mass Stipends if you want a Mass said for a particular intention, Tea and Coffee after Mass, and any other second collections that may be on that week.

Second Collection next Sunday for Missio (World Mission Sunday): Next Sunday there will be a second collection for the Catholic Church's Mission overseas. Missio ignites God's love by helping local missionaries to work alongside global communities that are poor or in need, regardless of their background or belief. Sometimes this need might be very specific: a motorbike for a Priest to celebrate Mass in remote villages; a simple community hall so people can gather together; vaccinations to protect vulnerable children. Whatever our missionaries need to help them share the joy of the Gospel, Missio strives to provide it.

Prisoners' Sunday: This Sunday is Prisoners' Sunday which raises funds for those working and those providing care for those who work in our prisons. You can donate to the charity PACT through the envelopes in the Narthex.

Gentle reminder about receiving communion:

When we receive communion, we receive Our Lord in Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity. The Lord who taught us The Our father, who cured diseases and ultimately died on The Cross for the forgiveness of our sins, is truly present in the Sacred Host. It IS the Body of Christ. Therefore, we must remind ourselves that we must receive Him with reverence and with full understanding of what it is we are receiving.

If you are in a state of grace and are receiving communion on the hand, please do not walk off before consuming the Body of Christ. Additionally, if you are physically able to do so, with the left hand on top of the right, hold out your hands, then using your right hand consume the Sacred Host.

Please also be mindful that some parishioners like to receive kneeling or on the tongue, please leave enough room between each person when processing for communion for anyone who may want to receive communion in this way. If you're not in a state of grace, or have not received your First Holy Communion, but would like a blessing, when in front of the Priest or Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion, please cross your arms to indicate this. Thank you.
